

Magic just out of top three

THE Waikato Bay of Plenty Magic are outside the top three of the ANZ Premiership netball standings after a 56-51 loss to the Northern Stars in Auckland on Wednesday.

The Magic did earn a bonus point in the loss, which could be crucial in making the play-offs, which will be made up of the top three teams.

With five games remaining the Magic are in fourth place, two points behind the Mainland Tactix. Opotiki's Monica Falkner played in the first three quarters of the game where she landed seven goals at goal attack.

It was the Stars' second win of the season and the two key figures were shooter Maia Wilson who slotted 42 goals from 46 attempts in a fine all-round game, and young custodian Kate Burley.

The Magic suffered an unexpected blow when a foot injury suffered during the warm-up ruled in-form captain Casey Kopua out of the match, her position at goal defence being picked up by Katherine Levien.

Magic delivered several mini runs to threaten on occasion but the visitors were generally laboured on attack and unable to break the shackles. The Magic made a comeback of sorts in the middle stages as shooter Lenize Potgieter shone at the attacking end, but they were not able to overcome the home team. The Magic host the second-placed Steel in round nine in Hamilton on Monday.
